SOIL

Our winery and vineyard are located about 450 meters (1,476 feet) above sea level, at the foothills of the Andes Mountains, 100 km. (62.13 miles) south of Santiago. The vines are planted in loam soils which contain similar proportions of sand, clay and lime in the first 300 mm (12 inches), followed by stones with an outstanding drainage and incomparable conditions for this vines.

CLIMATE

A Mediterranean climate with cold winters and average rainfalls, primarily during the winter months. Summers present medium high temperatures at night, which enables a slow ripeness of the grapes during the summer period. Thanks to the absence of rainfall during this maturation period the grapes were harvested under optimum conditions.

HARVEST

The 2012 – 2013 growth season was a challenging one, with cooler temperatures and rain during spring delaying the normal vegetative growing cycle of the vines by as much as two weeks in our Leyda Valley and Alto Cachapoal vineyards. In the Peumo and Colchagua vineyards were not that much delayed, resulting in a compact harvest. Careful planning and scheduling of picking was ever critical, so as to ensure the maximum quality of our fruit.

■ Winemaker Notes

Deep purple in color, this Carmenere offers aromas of black fruits, chocolate, and spice. Nicely rounded on the palate with medium body and a pleasing finish. Ideal with stews, lasagna, and other pasta dishes.
